







I'm worried that due to COVID-19, my learning will be affected and with the social distancing rules I am worried that I won't be able to make any new friends. I am also worried about things not going back to normal.
I'm stressed that I'm forgetting things that I've learned and that there'll be gaps in my knowledge when I start college.
I have only applied for one college. And they have emailed me back with no offer and they told me I can apply again at August after my summer results.

Looking forward to going to college but a little worried about meeting new people and making friends my place is now guaranteed and even though I met teachers on day would be good to get to know them more before starting course.
